NB : If any rider withdraws after the date of definite entries without a valid

excuse (example : illness or lameness), the competitor will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss suffered by the OC (i.e. limited to stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal.

IMPORTANT – All entries have obligatorily to be made online in the Hippobase system. Passwords will be given to the respective NF's after the entry in principle. No other entries will be accepted by the OC. Entry Forms not correctly filled out will not be accepted by the organising committee.

All competitors will receive free tickets for meals for the concerning competition days.

Competitors who arrives earlier, or stay longer after the free period, must inform the Organising Committee with the definite entries. The costs for these reservations has to be paid directly to the hotel.

Extra's, drinks, tips, etc. are for account of the competitors. Any competitor who will stay in another hotel than the one assigned to her/him, or who will not accept the rules of the assigned hotel, will have to pay the costs concerned and will lose all rights she/he is entitled to. Rooms, which are not used by the concerned competitor or are not used (no shows), according to their reservation, will be charged to his national federation.

2. GROOMS

Requests for accommodation (own account) must be sent with entries.

The grooms of the CSI-W riders (one per rider) will receive a total amount for the event of € 75,- for meals, and receive tickets for a breakfast on the boat.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms will be provided by the OC.

3. HORSES

Transport expenses to be paid by the OC competitor.

Accommodation for the horses at OC's expense in boxes 3 x 3 meter will be

available from Wednesday (14.00 hrs/02.00PM) until Monday (09.00AM)

Stabling for supplementary horses is not possible.

The stables are in the Brabanthallen with 24hrs. security. It is not allowed to smoke in the stable-area; breaking this rule will (in consultation with the Ground Jury) entail loss of right to enter the stable-area.

4. WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

Busses and/or courtesy-cars are available for transport from the hotels to the show ground and vice versa according to a time-schedule till one hour after the last competition each day from Wednesday till Sunday. Due to traffic problems there is no possibility to have transport from any airport. The organising committee will refund the train ticket from Amsterdam airport to the train station in 's-Hertogenbosch. The courtesy-cars are available for transport from the train station 's-Hertogenbosch to the show ground or hotel and vice-versa.

6. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES (Art. 136.1-2)

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.1-2. The stewards will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 136 of the General Regulations.

There will be no deductions from prize money for international competitors, according to the Dutch tax regulations.

Distribution of prizes will be made by bank-transfer.

Directly after the last competition the account per rider will be made.

The rider has to sign the account and inform the secretariat with his/her IBAN & BIC numbers.

5. **INSURANCES**

The Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organising Committee shall not be liable for any material or physical damage, accident or illness which may occur to owners, renters, competitors, horses and grooms, under any circumstances, within or out of the competition ground before, during or after the competitions. The Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser shall not be liable for damage to driving vehicles, saddlers, stable attachment and other property (including theft and loss).

The competitor indemnifies the Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser from liability with regard to claims made by third parties, including the owners and renters of the horses, for compensation by the Organiser, the Organising Committee and all persons working for the Organiser for all material or physical damage, of whatever nature, suffered by these third parties.

All owners, renters and competitors are personally liable for damages to third persons caused by themselves and all persons working for them, and caused by their horses. They are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

By making the definite entries for Indoor Brabant each competitor declares that he/she has taken notice of the Schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the Schedule and that the competitor explicitly agrees therewith.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

WARM-UP (10.30 hrs)

Each rider may train the horses entered for the CSI-W. Only horses which have passed the horse-inspection can be started. There will be approximately 6 obstacles in the arena with a maximum height of 1.35 meter. Each rider will have the possibility to train his horse over these obstacles in any order for a max. time of 50 seconds. Jumping is not obligatory.
